

## IJMIR: Manuscript Preparation Instructions

The manuscript should be prepared according to the following guidelines.

Manuscript should be written in English, M.S. Word and Times New Roman font, typed 1.5 lines spaced.

All research manuscript should have the following sections: Title of article, Abstract, Key words, Introduction, Materials and methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgement (if any) and References.

**Title:** Title of the Manuscript should be in bold face (font size 16), names of the authors in bold normal face (font size 12) followed by the address(es) in normal face (font size 11). Address(es) contain designation, name of organization, city and country. An asterisk (\*) must be placed after the corresponding authors name as superscript whose email id, fax, telephone number can be given. Corresponding author has the responsibility to ensure that all co-authors are aware and approve the contents of the submitted manuscript.

**Abstract:** (font size 11). A well-prepared abstract enables the reader to identify the basic content of a document quickly and accurately, to determine its relevance to their interests, and thus to decide whether to read the document in its entirety. The Abstract should be informative and completely self-explanatory, provide a clear statement of the problem, the proposed approach or solution, and point out major findings and conclusions. The abstract should be written in the past tense. Standard nomenclature should be used and abbreviations should be avoided. No literature should be cited.

**Keywords:** (font size 11). The keyword list provides the opportunity to add keywords, used by the indexing and abstracting services, in addition to those already present in the title. Judicious use of keywords may increase the ease with which interested parties can locate our article. Author(s) must give at least four keywords which are related to the major part of their research work.

The contents from Introduction to References should be in two columns (Except Large Tables, Graphs, Figures and Images).

**Introduction:** (font size 11). The Introduction should provide a clear background, a clear statement of the problem, the relevant literature on the subject, the proposed approach or solution, and the new value of research. It should be understandable to colleagues from a broad range of scientific disciplines.

**Materials and Methods:** (font size 11). This section must contain specific details about the materials studied, instruments used, specialized chemicals source and related experimental details which allows other research worker to reproduce the results. Obtain permission for all fully borrowed, adapted, and modified tables and provide a credit line in the footnote.

**Results and Discussions:** (font size 11). The results should be concisely presented. Results

and discussion may be separate or combined based on the author's requirement. Tables and figures should be designed to maximize the comprehension of the experimental data. The interpreted results should be explained clearly in discussions and should relate them to the existing knowledge in the field as clearly as possible.

Figures, graphs and tables should be inside the margins of page. Figure caption is placed below the figures and written as Fig. 1. Similarly, Table caption is placed above the Tables and written as Table 1. Do not use to put figure inside the border. Figures, Graph and Tables captions are flush centre and labels should be legible.

**Conclusion:** (font size 11). Conclusion section is mandatory and contains advantages, disadvantages, review the main part of research Manuscript and use of research work.

**Acknowledgement (if any):** (font size 11). This section can be kept at the end of the manuscript before reference section. This section can be used to acknowledge the help of those who do not qualify for authorship or to acknowledge funding, donated resources or significant contribution to the research.

**References:** (font size 9). References are most important part of research Manuscript therefore each citation must be right and complete. Authors are requested to use such references which are readily available. References are written in APA style of Roman scripts. The separate number (like [1], [2], [3]...) is given to each reference. Please use a consistent format for references. Please see examples below:
